THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MOU") is made by and between the ClinoSol Research Private Limited (hereinafter "ClinoSol"), and MNR Medical College and Hospital (hereinafter "MNRMCH"). Both ClinoSol and MNRMCH shall also be collectively referred to as the "Parties" or the "Institutions."

RECITALS WHEREAS, ClinoSol Research is an India's leading a clinical research training and resource consulting organization and MNRMCH is a Medical College.

WHEREAS, ClinoSol and MNRMCH desire to exchange the Mod for;

1. Internship for students (trained under ClinoSol Research Pvt. Lid.) in clinical research and its related fields.
2. GCP training and workshop conduction in mutual association with MNRMCH
3. Providing placement assistance to the students who have successfully completed the certification course (s) with ClinoSol.
4. Encouraging and supporting Research activities and article publications.
5. Supporting clinical trial/BA/BE study activities and hands-on exposure to the students
6. Supporting in conducting continuing medical education, health camps, empathy trainings. as well as other patient-centric services/events/educational programs, etc..
7. Supporting conferences virtual webinars for additional learning experiences that connects the students with latest advances and technologies in clinical research.

NOW THEREFORE, in contemplation of the mutually beneficial relationships to be established, and in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein. the sufficiency of which is hereby agreed to and accepted, the Parties agree as follows:

## TERMS

## 1. Purpose of the MOU: Definition.

1.1 The primary objective of this MOU is to create a means for cooperative efforts between
 ClinoSol and MNRMCH to affect the academic and clinical interchange of faculty, trained resources. and students, and clinical. academic and research information between the two Institutions.
1.2 The Parties agree that this MOU will provide the foundation and framework for later particular projects developed by clinical corporate and adminisuative units from the two


## 2. Validation Period of this MOU.

As stated in Section 1.2 above, this Memorandum of Understanding is intended only to provide a framework for separate and more formal and detailed written agreements by and between the Parties with regard to particular exchange endeavours. In this context, this MOU shall remain in place from $01^{\text {st }}$ June 2019 to $31^{\text {st }}$ May 2020 for one year, until:
2.1 Superseded by such a separate formal written agreement(s);
2.2 Terminated by either Party upon written notice of not less than ninety ( 90 ) days; or
2.3 At the latest, one (1) year from the execution of same, unless the Parties mutually agree in writing to extend same.

## 4. Areas of Collaborations.

1. I. Internship for students (trained under ClinoSol Research Pvt. Ltd.) in clinical research and its related fields.
2. GCP training and workshop conduction in mutual association with MNRMCH
3. Providing placement assistance to the students who have successfully completed the certification course (s) with ClinoSol.
4. Encouraging and supporting Research activities and article publications.
5. Supporting clinical trial/BA/BE study activities and hands-on exposure to the students
6. Supporting in conducting continuing medical education, health camps, empathy trainings, as well as other patient-centric services/events/educational programs, etc..

Supporting conferences/virtual webinars for additional learning experiences that connects the students with latest advances and technologies in clinical research.

### 4.2 Student Training

4.2.1 Students (medical and supporting staff) of either Institution who wish to engage in study in a non-degree granting program ("Certificate Program") at the other Institution mus meet the criteria established by the Receiving Institution for participation in that Program. Program that is developed will identify the specific requirements, rationale, goals and objectives, technical procedural skills, and personal skills necessary for successful completion.
4.2.2 Students must meet all applicable regulatory and admission standards of the Receiving Institution and obtain all required approvals from the Home Institution for participation in a Program. These standards include but are not limited to requirements for language proficiency; medical training and experience: license (if required); professional liability

insurance as applicable; personal health and travel insurance; vaccinations; VISA applications and other necessary governmental approvals or permissions.
4.2.3 The Home Institution is responsible for collecting and reviewing student requests and applications for study and formally recommending qualified students to the Receiving Institution for the study desired. Members of the "Monitoring Committee" from each respective Institution will oversee the experience for each student.
4.2.4 The Receiving Institution will make the final determination as to the acceptance of the student in each case, according to its policies and standards, and will notify the Home Institution in writing of the acceptance or rejection. The Home Institution will notify the student of the decision.
4.2.5 Each student accepted by the Receiving Institution will be expected to participate in the Receiving Institution at the same level of competency as any other student participating in the Program.
4.2.6 The Receiving Institution will have the right to remove any student from the Program. In this instance, the Receiving Institution will provide written notification to the Home Institution. The Home Institution will comply with the request for removal immediately.
4.2.7 Students who apply and are accepted to participate in a student elective rotation at a clinical site will comply with both all of the policies and procedures of the clinical site and the by-laws and regulations of the student elective program, as applicable, including but not limited to CLINOSOL guidelines and requirements for international students. Failure to so comply may result in immediate dismissal from the student elective program. Within the context of an approved Program, students will be permitted to provide only direct, supervised medical care and related services as may be permitted and that are consistent with the requirements of the Receiving Institution and Clinical site.
4.2.8 General orientation to a Program will be provided by the Receiving Institution, and orientation to a particular student elective rotation at a clinical site will be the responsibility of the clinical site.
4.2.9 For a student of one Institution wishing to participate in a student elective clinical rotation or to undertake a short-term non-degree research program under a specific faculty members) at the other Institution, the following must be completed:
4.2.9.1 Draft and submit a detailed study program for approval by the Home Institution.
4.2.9.2 If approved by the Home Institution, the Home Institution will submit the proposal to the Receiving Institution.
4.2.9.3 If approved by the Receiving Institution, the Receiving Institution and proposed supervising faculty will provide formal approval in writing to the Home Institution.

4.2.9.4 Upon approval, the Receiving Institution will render all necessary cooperation to facilitate the proposal.
4.2.9.5 Students undertaking a short-term research program may find their research experience enhanced by auditing advanced research courses at the Receiving Institution. The trainee's research advisors at the Receiving Institution shall advise the student in course selection and seek approval from the appropriate school for trainee participation in classes.

4.2.10 Travel, living expenses, and other associated costs related to The students are encouraged to seek scholarship and/or other forms of financial support both within and outside the Institutions as applicable.
4.2.11 The Receiving Institution will assist in finding housing and other such assistance to the visiting student(s) to ease their transition into a foreign culture and environment. However, the Receiving Institution shall have no liability or responsibility for the visiting student's ultimate selection of such housing.

### 4.3 Research Collaborations

4.3.1 Both Institutions will encourage biomedical research collaborations in areas of mutual interest. Details shall be specified in the particular written agreement for each collaboration.
4.3.2 Both Institutions will promote and facilitate exchange programs for career-oriented training program in clinical research. Such collaborative effort should be based on the mutual interests of the involved Principal Investigators in both Institutions and the prospective trainees.
4.3.3 In the event a joint research project is proposed by either Institution, such research efforts will be carefully scrutinized by both Parties to evaluate the value for the proposed joint effort, the qualifications of the proposed participating faculty members, and the location of the research activity. If a decision is made by both Parties to approve the proposed project as a possible joint effort, both Institutions will actively seek outside funding for the proposed joint research project. Final approval of the project will be subject, in part, to securing funding deemed sufficient by each Institution.
4.3.4 In such joint projects between the two Institutions, care will be taken to assure that there will be parity in the numbers and institutional ranks of the personnel involved. Any resulting publications shall include an acknowledgement of the contributions of each Institution in accordance with customary scientific practices.

## 5. Intellectual Property and Research Collaboration Agreements

5.1 All publications resulting from the educational. research, or clinical collaboration between the two Institutions shall acknowledge the existence of the collaboration formed under this MOU. Likewise, the relationship between the Parties shall be mentioned in all courses and formal presentations which result from any collaboration formed under this: MOU.
5.2 Each research project conducted jointly by the Parties shall be made under a formal written research collaboration agreement containing whatever terms the Parties mutually agree are necessary to address the intellectual property, research information and property interests that could result from the joint activity of the Parties. All such discussions of the Parties regarding these matters will at all times strive to preserve a harmonious and continuing relationship between the Parties.
5.3 All research and other activities conducfed under this MOU must be conducted in accordance with the laws, rules, and regulations applicable to each Institution.


## 6. Applicable Rules; Emergencies.

The Parties agree that the clinical and academic requirements of both educational Institutions will be respected and that all current policies, rules, regulations, and/or guidelines covering matters applicable to a Program will be shared with, and carefully followed by, the faculty members and students participating in the Program. In the event of a faculty member or student exposure to infectious or environmental hazards or other occupational injuries as a result of the clinical or research assignment, the faculty member or student will seek immediate medical attention consistent with the site's occupational exposure procedures. Such emergency care will be provided at the usual and customary charges.

## 7. Non-Discrimination.

The Parties agree to comply with local rules, regulations, executive orders, and laws forbidding unlawful discrimination.

## 8. Relationship of the Parties.

This MOU shall not be construed to create a relationship of a joint venture, partnership. brokers, employees, servants or agents between the Parties. The Parties to this MOU are acting as independent contractors representing their own respective independent Institution. With respect to any employee compensation for services provided in connection with this MOU, each Institution will be responsible for paying their own employees (including faculty), and properly withholding their own employees' taxes and other costs and fees as may be required.

This Memorandum of Understanding is a non-contractual, non-binding statement of the Parties' desire to engage in the exchange programs and activities outlined herein. This Memorandum of Understanding is not binding or enforceable on either Party by the other, and creates no legal responsibilities or obligations. In no event shall either Party be liable t the other for any direct, indirect, consequential, special (including multiple or punitive), or incidental damages of any kind arising from, and/or related to this MOU.

## 9. Use of Institutions' Name: Advertising and Publicity.

Neither Institution will use the other Institution's name, or any name that is likely to suggest that it is related to the other Institution, in any advertising, promotion or sales literature without obtaining the express written/mutually agreed oral consent of the other Institution.

## 10. Confidentiality.

The parties anticipate that within the context of this MOU it may be necessary or helpful to transfer information/data of a proprietary or otherwise sensitive or company-confidential nature ("Confidential Information"). All such information exchanged between the Parties shall be considered Confidential Information and shall not be used by the Parties except in the furtherance of the aims of this MOU, and further, neither Party, without the other Party's

express written consent, shall disclose to any third party any such Confidential Information. For the purposes of this MOU, the following definitions and exceptions shall apply to such information:
10.1 Definition. "Confidential Information" means any technical or business information furnished by one Party to the other pursuant to this MOU that is specifically designated as confidential. The disclosing party shall mark same with a written Confidential Information legend indicating its confidential status. The disclosing party shall document Confidential Information that is disclosed orally or visually in a written notice and deliver the notice to the receiving party as soon as possible within fifteen (15) days after the disclosure. In the notice, the disclosing party shall summarize the Confidential Information and reference the time and place of disclosure.
10.2 Obligations and Limitations. The receiving party shall maintain Confidential Information in confidence, except that the receiving party may disclose or permit the disclosure of Confidential Information to its trustees, directors, officers, employees, consultants, and advisors, who are obligated to maintain its confidential nature and who need to know the Confidential Information for purposes of this MOU. The receiving party may only use and reproduce Confidential Information to the extent necessary to carry out the purposes of this MOU.
10.3 Exceptions. The obligations do not apply to the extent, but the receiving party can demonstrate that the Confidential Information:
10.3.1 was publicly known prior to the time of its disclosure under this MOU ;
10.3.2 became publicly known after its disclosure under this MOU through means other than an unauthorized disclosure by the receiving party;
10.3.3 was previously known to, or independently developed or discovered by, the receiving party without use of the Confidential Information;
10.3.4 is or was disclosed to the receiving party by a third party having no obligation of confidentiality with respect to the Confidential Information; or
10.3.5 must be disclosed to comply with applicable laws or regulations or with a court or administrative order, as long as the disclosing party receives prior written notice of the pending compelled disclosure.

### 10.4 Ownership; No License.

The receiving party acknowledges that the disclosing party (or a third party entrustris $S_{5}$ Confidential Information to the disclosing party) owns the Confidential Information and all patent, copyright, trademark, trade secret, and other intellectual property rights associated with the Confidential Information. Neither party grants an option, license, or conveyance of any intellectual property rights to the receiving party under this MOU.

### 10.5 Return of Confidential Information; Obligations.

Upon termination of this MOU, or earlier at the request of the disclosing party, the receiving party shall return all originals, copies, and summaries of documents, materials, and other tangible manifestations of Confidential Information in its possession, custody, or control.


However, the receiving party may retain one copy of the Confidential Information in the possession of its legal counsel solely to monitor its understandings under this MOU. The obligation of the receiving party to return Confidential Information to the disclosing party survives until fulfilled.
10.6 Survivorship. This section 11 survives the expiration or other termination of this MOU for any reason whatsoever.

## 11. Notices.

This MOU is independent of any previous MOU between CLINOSOL and MNRMCH. Any notice to either Institution hereunder must be in writing signed by the presenting Institution and will be deemed delivered when mailed by postal service first class, by courier, or express mail when addressed as follows.

This MoU is being entered into by the two parties to set forth the terms and understandings to achieve the purpose as detailed below -


PRINCIPAL

## Purpose and scope of the MoU

The purpose and scope of the MoU shall be to jointly foster and promote women-owned or women-led start-ups in the fields of (but not limited to) Healthcare, Medicine, Biosciences, MedTech

## Roles \& Responsibilities of the Parties

## WE Hub

- WE Hub to connect relevant start-ups to MNR-FRI to facilitate technical support
- In addition, WE Hub will provide the start-up with business advisory support, strategy and roadmap planning, go-to-market strategy, customer acquisition and other ancillary incubation services
- MNR-FRI to facilitate technical support in terms of Ideation, Doctor-patient interaction, Evaluation and Validation, Regulatory guidance, Clinical Trials, and technical lab space


## Funding

Unless otherwise specifically agreed to in writing by the Parties, each Party will bear on their own the respective costs of carrying out the obligations under this MOU. In the event of any consequential financial obligations arising out of any initiative of the parties under this MoU, the parties would take appropriate decision by mutual discussion and understanding through separate document(s) on a case to case basis. In that case, taxes if any will be charged extra and withholding tax if any will be deducted by respective party on any financial transaction as per applicable laws.

## Nature of MoU

This YoU is not a legally binding document and serves only as a guideline of the terms of engagement mutually agreed to between the said partners. The said YoU shall in no form be legally enforceable and has no binding on either party/ partner involved in the same.

## Article 1

## 1. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, INVENTIONS AND INNOVATIONS

1.1 All intellectual property held by either Party to this MoU , prior to entering into this MoU or disclosed or introduced in connection with this MoU and all materials in which such intellectual property is held, disclosed or introduced shall remain the property of the Party introducing or disclosing it.


Chairperson

1.2 All Programme materials that are created, developed by the Parties jointly for the purpose of this MoU shall be owned jointly by both the Parties. Neither of the Parties, shall, while using the Programme Materials in future, represent or declare that the Programme Materials were solely created by it.
1.3 Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as a license or transfer or an obligation to enter into any further agreement with respect to any intellectual property currently licensed to or belonging to either Party.

## Article 2

2. REPRESENTATION TO THE PUBLIC AND CONFIDENTIALITY
2.1 Neither of the Parties shall use the name or logo of the other for any purpose whether in relation to any advertisement or other form of publicity without obtaining the prior written consent of the other Party.
2.2 None of the terms or provisions of this MoU shall be disclosed by either Party without the prior written approval of the other Party, to any person other than the Party's advisors for purposes of assisting such Party in connection with the Programme (provided that the disclosing Party shall ensure that such advisors shall be under an obligation not to disclose the same to any other person) and unless required by any applicable laws and rules to which the disclosing Party may be subject. Notwithstanding the generality of the above, the Parties may notify third parties of the fact that this MoU is in effect.
2.3 All information furnished in relation to this MoU by one Party to the other, which is clearly identified as proprietary, sensitive or confidential at the time of disclosure, will be kept confidential by the receiving Party, and will not be disclosed to any third party otherwise than to carry out the provisions of this MoU, unless such disclosure has been agreed in writing between the Parties.
2.4 The provisions of this Articte will not apply to any information in the public domain; information in the possession of the receiving Party prior to the disclosure of the information; information which is independently developed by the receiving Party;

information required to be released by law; and information which is rightfully received by receiving Party from third parties without any breach of confidentiality obligations.
2.5 This Article will survive the expiration or termination of this MoW for one (1) year from the date of expiration or termination of this MoU.

## Article 3

3. AMENDMENTS
3.1 This MoU may be amended and supplemented in writing at any time as decided and agreed by mutual written consent of the Parties.

## Article 4

4. TERM AND TERMINATION OF MOU
4.1 This YoU shall commence on the Effective Date and shall remain in force for a period of one (1) year or the successful completion of the Programme (the "Term"), whichever is later. After the expiry of the Term, this YoU shall stand terminated. Both the Parties, may enter into similar MoU/Understanding for future collaborations. If either of the Parties wishes to terminate this MoU , the same may be done by way of 30 days' notice.
4.2 Either Party may at any time, by way of 2 (two) weeks' notice, intimate to other party, its intent of terminating this MOU.

## Article 5

5. GOVERNING LAWS
5.1 In respect to its performance in India, this MoU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India and enforceable in the Courts of Hyderabad, India.

## Article 6

## 6. ARBITRATION

6.1 Any dispute or difference between the Parties with regard to this MoU and all related matters whatsoever shall be discussed and settled amicably. In the event of any failure to resolve the disputes or differences amicably within Thirty (30) days, all such disputes or differences whatsoever, shall be referred to arbitration. The arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in English and in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Arbitration and

Conciliation Act, 1996 or any statutory modification or enactment thereof. The venue of Arbitration shall be Hyderabad, India. The Parties have agreed that a sole arbitrator shall be appointed mutually by both the Parties. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the Parties

# Memorandum of Understanding

Dr T. Venkat Ramaniah (Principal) MNR MEDICAL COUEGE \& HOSPITAL, Sejal.B (Director) GENGISPHARMA hereinafter (MNR MEDICAL COLLEGE \& HOSPITAL) and [GENGISPHARMA] located at [38, Block-A, Kukatpally Industrial Estate, Balanagar, Hyderabad, Telangana 500037].

In the spirit of friendship and with mutual interest in cooperation, MNR MEDICAL COLLEGE \& HOSPITAL and GENGISPHARMA enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (IoU) to promote joint educational and cultural collaboration and agree as follows:

## ARTICLE 1: SCOPE OF COLLABORATION

1.2 Any specific activity developed under this MOU shall be detailed in a subsequent agreement, signed by each institution's authorized signatory, which will describe the scope of the proposed activity, intended outcomes, budget, and responsible departments or individuals.
1.3 All activities shall be subject to the availability of funds and the approval of each institution's authorized representatives.

## ARTICLE 2: DURATION AND EVALUATION

2.1 This MOU shall be in effect for a period of [1] year from the last date of signature. Either party may request termination of this agreement, in writing, ninety (90) days prior to the proposed termination date. Any activities in progress at the time of termination shall be permitted to conclude as planned unless otherwise agreed in writing.
